

Experience the mountains in the first gamified museum in the world

Welcome to the playful path of the "Escape to the Bivouac" adventure Mountains are unpredictable.

The weather can change in an instant. A storm is approaching and you have but one solution: escape to the bivouac! Will you decipher the hidden codes? Will you avoid the gaps and traps? Will you remember the right path? Will you find the right bivouac and be saved?



Enjoy the museum story that you experience as you climb the mountains. Through eleven content sections you will pass the milestones of the history of Slovenian mountaineering, alpine, and mountain rescue, get to know the impulse that has always drawn people to the mountains, and feel the unique attraction and magic of the mountains. The museum alpine trail is marked by Knafelc (target) waymarks. On your way to the summit of the chosen mountain you can collect all the stamps through various experiences, interactive tasks, and tests ... and receive a prize at the end.

Come and enjoy a walk across the Slovenian peaks with the help of 360-degree spatial photography. The walk along the summit ridge of Triglav

will take your breath away! Experience or re-experience it in our museum, even if only in virtual reality.

A climbing harness is an indispensable part of your equipment when moving on challenging or very challenging trails. We use it along with a via ferrata kit when walking on secured trails. Put on the via ferrata kit and climb along the wire rope.



If there are no waymarks, a cairn will come to your aid. Add a new rock to the top of an existing cairn or create a new one so the mountaineers that follow will be able to find the right

Weigh the frame pack

A frame pack was the predecessor to the rucksack, but is not yet completely out of fashion for carrying loads and material into the mountains. Sometimes carriers would carry frame packs of up to 80kg; try to guess how much ours



Good preparation is at least half of a successful trip! The most important part of each mountaineer's equipment are good mountain boots and a carefully packed rucksack. Think about what you will take on your mountain tour in your rucksack.
